

Message from the Senior Management Team



Keen to be Green

The school is currently planning to carry out a recycling challenge supported by 'recyclenow' and 'School Projects'. The challenge engages children with the concept of rubbish and recycling from a different perspective and asks them first to audit the kinds of waste they create in the school. They are then asked to reflect on ways this rubbish can be reduced, recycled or reused.

Using this information, children think of their own whole-school project which will allow them to reduce waste across the school. They must set out criteria to establish the perimeters and determine what will have happened for the project to be deemed as successful. Children will then measure and monitor progress until the task reaches its agreed end point. The experiment is written up by the school and submitted to the Schools Project team, who collate it with the data from other schools so the results can be shared.

While primarily a Design and Technology task for Key Stage 2 challenge, children in Lower Primary will also be asked to contribute to the exciting and useful project.

We will be talking to the children about this this week and will ask them to share the ideas with you. Our recycling boxes are looking full this week, so please take

some of the rubbish home to recycle if you are able to.

Please remember that certain items, such as carry-out coffee cups and plastic bags cannot be recycled, so this rubbish must go in the bin.

Drop-Off & Pick-Up

Please remember that children MUST be seen into the building each morning by an adult. Parents that have an arrangement to drop-off early to their class teacher must ensure the teacher is aware of the child's presence before the supervising adult leaves. Likewise, children using the school grounds for play after school must also be supervised by an adult.

Due to regulations, it is also necessary for us to supervise children who are picked up late using a more structured system.

Therefore, children who are collected late will be asked to wait in the office with Joy, whom will then ask you to complete the sign-out book.
